Dear Participant,

Research and Written Work to be Completed	3
1. A reflection paper on current best practices and where you think your school district can improve on the attitudes and actions when autism is in the classroom and what you would like to see more information on in the future. (1 to 2 pages)	1
2. Resource List: create a list of some of the most common behaviors in a child with autism and the interventions you gleaned from the course that you might be able to use in your work going forward. (1-2 pages)	1
3. Complete the final exam including thoughts, behaviors and actions you plan to implement that are outlined in the final exam description with a 70% passing grade.	1

Description of Assignment 1:

Complete a 1 to 2-page paper reflecting on current best practices a teacher may employ to increase the capability of learning and promote a positive environment for the child with autism in your classroom.

Description of Assignment 2:

Review your course notes and materials and create a list of common behaviors found in a child with autism and the appropriate interventions you may be able to use in your own classroom for the benefit of the child with autism and the class as a whole. Your final list should include at least six common behaviors and the interventions you feel will have the greatest positive impact. (1 to 2 pages)

Description of Assignment 3:

Complete the final exam paper including the qualities found in the description. (1-2 pages)

THE GRADE PLAN

To earn a grade of “A”: Fully complete all coursework materials and required reading including passing the quiz with a 90% score, submit an action plan you will immediately employ in your work setting, and submit the minimum documentation required on the syllabus in a timely manner.

To earn a grade of “B”: Fully complete all coursework materials and required reading including passing the quiz with an 80% score, submit an action plan you will immediately employ in your work setting, and submit two of the three required assignments (final exam required) on the syllabus in a timely manner.

To earn a grade of “C”: Fully complete all coursework materials and required reading including passing the quiz with a 70% score, and successfully pass the final exam with a minimum 70% score.

Failure to meet the requirement of an “A”, “B”, or “C” will result in failure of the class.
