The Writing to Read research from the Carnegie Corporation by Steve Graham and Michael Hebert will be utilized to identify the cluster of closely related instructional practices shown to be effective in improving students' reading. The report groups these practices within three core recommendations in order of the strength of their supporting evidence.
